1. Define grace.

4. Share your own personal testimony. How has God's grace changed you?
5. What are some everyday examples of God's grace?
6. Share a recent example of God's grace toward you.
7. How has the story of God's grace in another person's life encouraged you?
8. Sometimes telling about our former sins may cause others to stumble. How do we determine if we should or should not reveal our past sins? Suggest some guidelines for deciding when and how to express former sins.
9. List some of your favorite Scripture verses about grace.



## Personal Reflection and Response

1. Throughout this week, keep a diary of the evidences of God's grace.
2. Spend some time quietly pondering your former sin and God's grace in saving you. Write your own doxology of praise.
3. Write your own personal testimony expressing who you were before coming to Christ; who you are in Christ; and the difference grace has made in you.
