



## Group Discussion and Application

1. What new information did you learn about the plagues in our study?
2. Share some of your own observations on the plagues.
3. What is the stated purpose of the first plague in 7:17? Consider 7:17 in light of 5:2. In what way was the purpose of 7:17 fulfilled?
4. What do many people try to find natural explanations for miraculous events? How would you respond to a person who said they did not believe the miracles recorded in the Bible?
5. Discuss the statement by Peter Enns that, *"We sometimes too quickly make a distinction between a natural phenomenon and an act of God."* What is the result of doing this?
6. Review Pharaoh's responses to Moses and Aaron after each plague. What lessons do we learn from Pharaoh's responses to the plagues?
7. What lessons do we learn in the distinction made between Egypt and Israel beginning in plague 4 (8:21-23; 9:6, 11, 25f; 10:22f)?
8. What was the response of the Egyptian magicians in 8:19 and 9:11? What was the response of some of the Egyptians in 9:20? What was the response of Pharaoh's servants in 10:7?  
What do you think these people's attitude was toward Pharaoh at this point?
9. What questions do you have about the plagues?



## Personal Reflection and Response

1. Examine the condition of your own heart before God.
2. What is your own attitude toward the miracles recorded in Scripture?
3. Do your own study on the plagues of Egypt. Consider questions like: Why these particular plagues? What similarities and differences are found in the plagues?

2. Review the first nine plagues (Ex. 7:14-10:29). Which would you have dreaded most? Why? List some lessons we to be learn from the plagues?
