3. What two extremes were mentioned with regard to the interpretation of symbolism? Which do you think is the greater problem today? Why?
4. What are some of the values of symbols? Some of the dangers?
5. What are some of the criteria we should use to determine if our understanding of the meaning of a Bible text and its applications are appropriate?
6. Read Ex. 30:9 and Lev. 10:1-3. Why was God so concerned about the way His people worshipped Him? What is the application for today?
7. What lessons do we learn about prayer from the altar of incense?
