5. How is Christ seen as prophet, priest and king from these verses?
6. Demonstrate how these verses trace the Son of God from eternity past, thru history (incarnation, crucifixion, exaltation) and into eternity future.
7. How do unbelievers generally view Jesus?
8. What are some common misunderstandings among believers with regard to the points in this study?
9. What questions about the Son of God did this study raise in your mind?
