 - Does “again” in v.6 refer or another bringing of the Son, or to another supportive saying (as in v.5)?
 - V.6 says, “when he brings the firstborn into the world.” When was this? To what does “world” refer?
 When we are confronted with such questions, how do we decide which of several possible interpretations is correct? What criteria, processes, resources help us decide?
3. What or whom do people in our day place above God’s Son as authoritative? How do they demonstrate this?
4. What are some of the important theological issues and cautions to keep in mind as we study this passage?
What are some of the attributes of God the Son we find in Heb. 1:1-14?
5. There seems to be continued interest in angels in our day. Why?
What are some of the questions you have about angels?
6. What does this passage (and others) teach us about angels? If you decided to do further personal study on the subject of angels, what kinds of resources would you use?
7. What do you see as some appropriate and practical applications of this passage?
