4. What are some of the personal implications of the truths considered in this study? E.g., what does it mean personally and practically that Jesus fully identifies with us as human beings?
5. What lessons can we learn concerning our own Christian suffering from this study?
6. Summarize the Bible's teaching concerning the person of Christ. Support with Scripture. Why is our view of the person of Christ so important?
7. Bonus: Explain the idea of "inaugurated" (already, not yet) eschatology. How do we see this in our text?
8. What questions do you have from this study?
