6. Why are we at times hesitant to ask others to pray for us?
7. Why is it important to tell others we are praying for them?
Why are we sometimes slow to tell others we are praying for them?
8. List some of the things we should pray for others.
9. Of the 11 “rules for church conduct” we have examined, which are most neglected in our day? Why? What is the result?
