3. How can we help assure that our celebration of the Lord's Table is meaningful and prevent its observance from becoming empty form?
4. How have our studies in Exodus helped your understanding of this study from Mark 14? How has this study from Mark 14 increased your understanding of Exodus? What lessons are to be learned from this connection?
5. It was common at the conclusion of the Passover meal to remain for several hours and talk about God's past and future acts of redemption. Take some time this morning to share:
 - a) some of God's past mercies to you
 - b) some of the blessing yet to be enjoyed by the redeemed.
