5. Explain the Biblical concept of *fearing* God?
6. What lessons are to be learned by the heads of families from this text?
7. How are we to harmonize God choosing us (see Jn 15:16) with Joshua's charge to choose God (Josh 24:14f)?
8. Review: Thinking back through our studies in Joshua, which were most meaningful and helpful to you personally? Why? What was the most important truth you learned? How has our study thru Joshua helped you as a believer?
